The coach will also support the broader vision of the school's Sports department, instilling values such as teamwork, determination, and sportsmanship.

Principal Responsibilities

Main duties

Plan and deliver engaging and high-quality hockey coaching sessions for pupils of varying skill levels.

Provide tactical and technical coaching with a focus on developing pupils' skills, understanding, and appreciation for the game.

Inspire and encourage pupils to excel, promoting a growth mindset and commitment to continuous improvement.

Take an interest in the performance of the school's hockey teams.

Leading the Senior after school hockey activity each week.

Work closely with the school's sports department to align the hockey programme with overall school sports goals and initiatives.

Foster a safe, respectful, and inclusive team culture that aligns with the school's values of kindness, respect, and positivity.

Utilise all opportunities to work closely with other members of the sports department, sharing knowledge and experiences.

From time to time the key responsibilities may be varied. Halstead St Andrew's School expects its employees to work flexibly with the framework of the duties and responsibilities above. - Organisation and planning: Well-organised with the ability to plan, structure, and execute comprehensive coaching sessions tailored to individual and team needs

Working Conditions and Remuneration

The role is offered as fixed term for the Spring term from 7 January 2025 to Friday 28 March 2025 inclusive, comprising five hours a week. Flexibility is essential due to lessons being on different days. One hour will include an after school club.
